



# Alex Timpson Attachment and Trauma Programme in Schools

Dear parent/carer/guardian,

Your child/foster child's school is taking part in the Alex Timpson Attachment and Trauma Programme. This is a national programme that provides training to improve support for children and young people who struggle at school because of their behaviour. The **Rees Centre**, at the University of Oxford, is working with pupils and staff to explore if this training is making a difference.

Your child/foster child, alongside other pupils from the same year, has been selected to take part in a survey, which will involve completing a short online questionnaire. The survey asks about experiences at school and what helps children to learn. The questions are asked in a way that is appropriate for your child/foster child's age. The survey is anonymous meaning that we will not know what answers your child/foster child gives.

The survey will be carried out under the supervision of school staff, who will explain what the survey is about, that pupils do not have to complete it if they do not want to, and they can skip any questions they do not want to answer.

We hope that you are happy for your child/foster child to join the 1,000s of pupils who have already taken part in this important research. **If you are happy for your child/foster child to do the survey, no further action is needed.** If you do not want your child/foster child to take part, please return the attached form to the school.

## Frequently asked questions

## Does my child/foster have to take part in the survey?

Taking part is voluntary. Your child/foster child or school will not be affected if they do not do the survey.

## Who will have access to the survey answers?

Qualtrics is the platform we use to collect anonymized survey answers, meaning that survey answers are not linked to your child/foster child's name when they are collected by Qualtrics and then passed on to us. Qualtrics privacy notice can be found here:

Responsible members of the University of Oxford may be given access to anonymized survey answers to monitor the study.

## How will the survey be used?

The survey will provide important information on how we can do things better in schools. It will identify better training and support for staff and could influence how money is spent.

## Who is involved in the research?

The evaluation is directed by Neil Harrison, Deputy Director of the Rees Centre and Associate Professor at Oxford University and is funded by the Alex Timpson Trust.

The study has been approved by the Department of Education Research Ethics Committee at the University of Oxford, reference number ED-CIA-18-110.

## **Data Protection**

The survey answers will be kept for at least seven years after completion of the study, and then securely disposed of.
