<u>Makaton</u>

At Rose Green Infant School, we believe all children have the right to feel happy

and safe in their learning environment. One way we encourage this is by talking with and listening to them



every day. For some children, talking is not always easy so we use visual resources and actions to support them. We have had fantastic training to use *Makaton* with our pupils; a fun, interactive and inclusive way to communicate.

'Makaton is a unique language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to



communicate. ... With *Makaton*, signs are used, with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear.' (<u>www.makaton.org</u>)

We will be learning a new sign every week so please look out for our '*Makaton Magic*' in the newsletter each month and have fun signing and talking with your children! A Plea

Please, please could we ask that:




Makaton
