### Book Week (2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> March)

We have lots of exciting things planned during Book Week.

On Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March we have a book fair coming to school. It will be in the hall from 3.00 p.m. onwards. We do hope that you and your child will be able to come along and support this. The Broadway Boogie after school dance club will be held in Sycamore Class on this day.



On Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March, to celebrate World Book Day, we would like to invite the children to come to school dressed as their favourite book character (or in their pyjamas) and to bring in their favourite bedtime story to share with the rest of the class. Children are very welcome to bring in slippers to wear at school but will also need appropriate footwear for outside play (and a warm coat!). A world book day token will be sent out after half term.

On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March, we will be having a used 'book swap' in school. Children can bring any unwanted books to school which they then can swap with another child. We are hoping to get lots of books, so that everyone can take a book home with them.



And finally, we are so excited to be taking part in BookFest again this year. On 12<sup>th</sup> February, the author Simon Philip will be visiting the children to talk about being an author and to share his books 'Perfect Pedro' (KS1) and 'I really want the Cake' (Reception). Each child will be given a free signed copy of his book. We are hoping this will inspire some of our aspiring writers!

All classes will also be visiting Willowhale Library during March - further details will be sent out nearer the time.

#### Pupil Premium/Free School Meals Funding Eligibility

Just a reminder that families who receive certain benefits or who are on a low income may be eligible to free school meals funding which the school receives an allocated amount for. We use this additional funding to subsidise school trips and pay for one after school club per week for the eligible pupils. 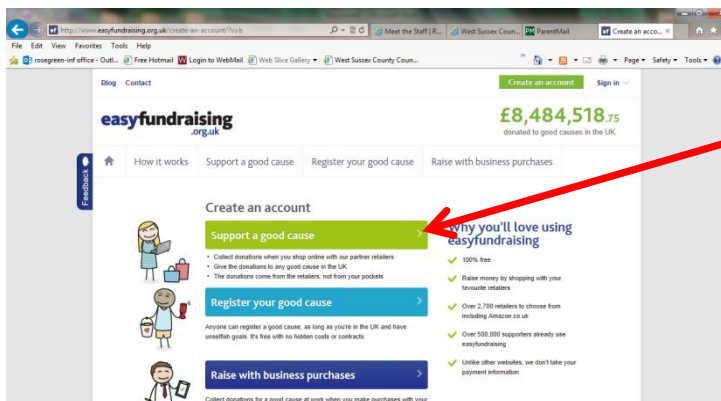
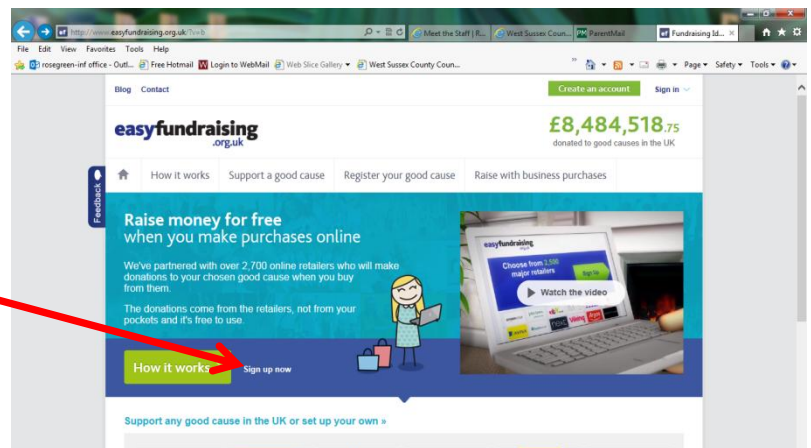
**Do you shop online? Yes?**

Please can you look at the Easyfundraising website as the potential is huge! As an example, if you wanted to buy a book from Amazon for £10, first log onto the Easyfundraising website and then click on the link for Amazon. You will be directed to the usual Amazon website (including all their discounts etc.). **You can then purchase the book as usual.** The benefit for you / the school is that the school gets 2.5% of the purchase value. That only equates to 25p, but if all parents sign up and order items throughout the year it will soon mount up. There are over 2,700 retailers linked from this website including ...

# Reading Newsletter January 2026

Happy New Year to you all! Thank you for taking time to read the newsletter. Our aim is to support each child's progress in Reading and their enjoyment of reading a range of texts.

This year The Department for Education has announced that 2026 will be The National Year of Reading. This is because there has nationally been a 'steep decline in reading amongst children, young people and adults' (National Literacy Trust.) The theme for the year is 'Go All In.' Reading is the key to all learning and we know that confident readers make better academic progress throughout their school careers than those who don't. (GL Assessment)

At school we assess and track continuously to promote and encourage good progress. We also provide many opportunities through our schemes of work to develop Reading for Pleasure.

But what can you do at home? Often our most confident and successful readers are children who...

- Are read to each night at bedtime
- Practise their reading every day
- Have a book box or book shelf in their bedroom
  - Visit the library regularly
  - Have parents who read
  - Say that they love reading

For every birthday party that your child is invited to this year, why not buy a book for that child?

We have many exciting events coming up at school. On the 12<sup>th</sup> of February, we have Simon Philip, a local author coming to visit school. He will read and present one of his books to all of the children and then each child will be given a FREE BOOK, signed personally by him. This is organised by BookFest a local charity who aim to give books to as many children as possible.

In the UK, "2 in 5 children between the ages of 5 and 8 from disadvantaged backgrounds do not own a book of their own" and "3 in 10 eleven year olds in Chichester leave primary school unable to read at the level expected for their age." (National Literacy Trust). 'As a charity we are committed to encouraging children of all ages to read books, opening their minds and inspiring a love of words'(BookFest)

The 2<sup>nd</sup> March is Book Week and the 5<sup>th</sup> March is World Book Day. The teachers will be planning lots of exciting and inspiring things for that week.
