Attachment and Trauma Programme

Our school has agreed to take part in the Alex Timpson Attachment and Trauma Programme which is a national programme that provides training to improve support for children who struggle at school because of their behaviour. Linking Voices

At Rose Green Infants, all the children in the whole school are part of our School Council and every child has been given the opportunity to have a voice. We have Class Council meetings every fortnight and one



representative from each class is a 'Linking Voice' who is the link between the children in their class and the adults in school who normally make most of the decisions. The Linking Voices will meet with Mrs Sugden every fortnight to discuss questions and ideas and then take these back to their classes. Makaton

At Rose Green Infant School, we believe all children have the right to feel happy and safe in their learning environment. One way we encourage this is by



talking with and listening to them every day. For some children, talking is not always easy so we use visual resources and actions to support them. We have had fantastic training to use *Makaton* with our pupils; a fun, interactive and inclusive way to communicate.

'Makaton is a unique language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to communicate. ... With Makaton, signs are used, with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear.' (www.makaton.org)

We will be learning a new sign every week so please look out for our 'Makaton Magic' in the newsletter each month and have fun signing and talking with your children! The signs we have been learning during October are attached. We also use video clips from CBeebies 'Something Special'. Use the link below to explore some Makaton Magic with your family and friends!

A Plea

Please, please could we ask that:

- If your child is having packed lunches, as a healthy school we ask that you do not put any sweets or bars of chocolate such as mars bars in lunchboxes. We also ask that you avoid putting any nut products i.e. peanut butter sandwiches in lunchboxes as we have two children in school with a severe allergy to nuts. Also if your child brings a yoghurt for lunch, please can you remember to provide them with a spoon.
- For health and safety, please can your child avoid wearing hooped ear-rings to school.
 All ear-rings need to be covered with tape during PE (it would be helpful if you could provide your child with a reel of micro pore tape that can be kept in their drawer)
