Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now well into the Spring term and the children are enjoying their new topics - please ask them about their learning in school!

I am afraid that I need to do a reminder around parking near the school. It has been brought to the school's attention that a number of people are parking dangerously and inconsiderately on the corners of the road as you enter Hawkins Close (which are yellow zig zag lines and so should not be parked on). This makes it dangerous for people trying to cross the road as they cannot see, and therefore vehicles cannot see them. It also makes it difficult for vehicles to get in and out of the close when other vehicles are parked right on the actual junction. We try to maintain good relationships with our neighbours but thoughtless and dangerous parking does not help. In the two and a half years I have been at the school we have had several near misses and I do not want a serious accident to occur as the result of the actions of our school community. Please think before you park.

We will also be planning a Social event in the Spring term for Parent Carers and there is a further Expert Parent Programme workshop on Mental Health coming up in March - Booking forms not yet released.

We are also working in co-production with West Sussex County Council with the Autism in Schools project, we are looking forward to more schools joining when the pilot expands and working them too. I have included the link for the press release around this which gives more details.

To be eligible to join: You are a dad to an under 18 year old and you have been out of work for more than 12 months.




