Here are some ideas for the children over the next couple of weeks... Our topic is 'Dragons'

Literacy

Imagine you're a dragon—write a letter to tell a friend things that you have been doing e.g. Today I have been breathing fire at.... I have captured 3 princesses etc. Don't forget to set your letter out properly with an address.

Find an interesting picture (could be Pobble365/Literacy Shed or a magazine/newspaper cutting) and write some descriptive sentences about them- remember to use your best handwriting, adjectives and adverbs for more detail.

Research 'Real Life Dragons' - could you make a poster, fact file or zig-zag book to present your work?

Try and read lots of different things - non-fiction texts, magazines, comics, poems etc. Write a book review of your latest book.

Can you find out about any traditions around the world that include dragons? Why do they have a dragon in the Chinese Zodiac? Why is there a red dragon on the welsh flag? Can you find out about the Patron Saint of England St George?

Maths

Do some cooking—weigh out and measure the ingredients and make sure you read the scales carefully. Discuss units of measurement (grams/kilograms and millilitres/ litres)
