This enabled teachers to develop and extend planning of lessons, develop confidence in the teaching of PE and children were inspired through new ideas. This CPD offered through the SSP gets children and adults excited about PE through the implementation of new ideas. These new activities were introduced through lessons and as one off activities during sports week, organised by the PE leader.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children were able to develop their leadership skills through PAL training. Some of these skills were then implemented in PE lessons through children leading activities and warm ups, younger children were inspired by the games the PALs played at playtimes. The PE conference provides an opportunity for the PE leader to take part in and hear about new initiatives in sport and PE. It is an opportunity to find out what is available to schools and is an opportunity for learning and celebrating what is happening in schools across Sussex. Mrs Knight taught lessons to Year 1 and 2 throughout the year. She taught alongside the class teachers, enables teachers to support their children and learn from an 'expert PE teacher' Her lessons often include inspiring ideas, extending the children's learning and physical skills as well as their emotional and team skills. Feedback from class teachers and children is always positive.

Parents drop the children off and the coaches bring them back to school. Without this cost we would be unable to attend.
Cost of 6 week fencing taster course for all Year 2 children	£900	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tamsin Year 2 "I liked it when we used the metal swords, we had to wear white suits, so we didn't get hurt when people poked us. We had to do what the teacher said or it might be dangerous. It was fun. At the end, if we were good you got a silver or gold medal, or you could get a trophy." Children learnt about behaviour while taking part in sporting activities and, fencing is an opportunity for children to take part in individual competitive sport.

This needs continuous organisation and regularly replacing. During sports week all children took part in different and fun activities daily.

The assessment process enables the PE leader to set targets and to plan to make the teaching of PE even better.
Cost of supply for 2 teachers to attend afternoon rehearsals for West Sussex Dance House Festival at The Alexandra Theatre (Year 2 Dance Club)	£382	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children performed a cheerleading dance on the theme of teamwork. Teachers used skills learnt on CPD to teach the children. Children experienced dancing on a stage to a live audience, this developed confidence amongst all of the children.
Resources to improve and extend PE curriculum throughout the school - general small apparatus i.e balls, skipping ropes & sports day medals, staff PE polo shirts, costumes for dance house, equipment to encourage active maths and literacy.	Total costs £1,000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each year group had a different piece of equipment during sports week. The children were asked to challenge themselves to learn something new with their equipment during the week. All children practised every day during playtimes and developed skills and abilities. Children were keen to take their equipment home to demonstrate and include their families in their new ability. Props and costumes provided the dancers at Dance House a rich experience. Most of the costume has been used for 4 years now, Teachers and TA's use their skills to make the costumes for the children. Some equipment was bought to enrich active maths and literacy lessons. Teachers planned for these subjects, making them active and linked to topics taught in these subjects.
