 Listen with increased attention to sounds. Explores and learns how sounds and movements can be changed Sings familiar songs, e.g. pop songs, songs from TV programmes, rhymes, songs from home Sing the pitch of a tone sung by another person ('pitch match'). Sing the melodic shape (moving melody, such as up and down, down and up) of familiar songs. Create their own songs or improvise a song around one they know. Respond to what they have heard, expressing their thoughts and feelings. Taps out simple repeated rhythms. Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas. 	 Begins to build a collection of songs and dances Makes music in a range of ways, e.g. plays with sounds creatively, plays along to the beat of the song they are singing or music they are listening to. Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses. Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody. Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups. 	 Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs; Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others, and – when appropriate – try to move in time with music.
